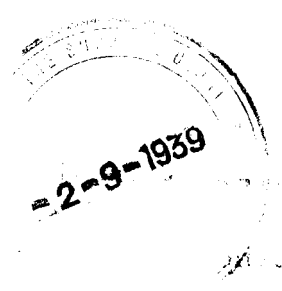

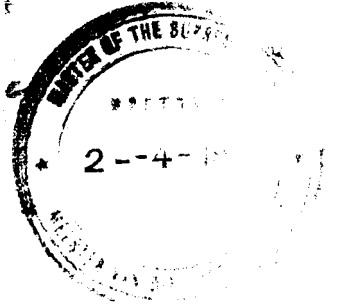

RE: ESTATE OF THE LATE COMMANDER J.R.F. WILD.

In reply to your letter of the 22nd instant relative to the above Estate, I beg to advise you that an amount of £10 is due by this Company to the Estate of the late Commander J.R.F. Wild. Kindly advise me whether a cheque for the above amount should be forwarded to you.

The amounts mentioned in the foregoing paragraphs are due to Mrs. Wild and not to the Estate.

Rule No. 13 appearing in the Book of Rules and Regulations of the Klerksdorp District Mines' Sick Benefit Society reads as follows :

'Each member of the Society shall nominate some person (or the Committee of the Society) to whom on the death of such member or as soon as possible thereafter, a sum not exceeding £30 (Thirty Pounds) shall be paid. The sum shall be used strictly for the relief of the dependents of the deceased, and in a case where the Company Management is the nominee and there are no dependents, it shall be paid to the next of kin of the deceased.'

In this case the nominee is Mrs. Wild and payment of £30 will be made to her at an early date.

An ex gratia payment of £10 will be made to Mrs. Wild by this Company.

O P I N I O N.

Commander Frank Wild was twice married. His first wife is now Mrs. Vera Levinge, who lives in London. He married his second wife, now his widow Mrs. Beatrice Wild, in 1931. He and his second wife entered into an antenuptial contract on 17th March 1931 whereunder he undertook to give her, within five years, a residence worth £1,000. This undertaking was never fulfilled. Commander Wild died at Johannesburg on 19th August, 1939, without issue.

After his widow, as Executrix dative, had filed an account with the Master, in which the whole of the balance of his assets, amounting to £290 odd was awarded to herself on her claim under the antenuptial contract, Mrs. Vera Levinge came to light with a will made by Wild on 9th January 1929 in her favour, and with a claim for £1,575 in respect of two notes in her favour made by Wild ^{after} during their ^{divorce} marriage.

Of these two notes, the first reads as follows :

"5th February 1926: I do hereby declare that I owe to Vera Alexandra Wild, at present residing at 12 London Road, Reading, the sum of £575, I having borrowed this sum from her in October 1924."

The other reads :

"18th June, 1928: This is to certify that I, Robert Francis Wild, of the above address, have borrowed from time to time, and do still owe to Vera Alexandra Wild, the sum of £1,000, and that I agree to repay this sum in the future whenever I can, at intervals or in instalments, until the said debt be paid off".

Both are signed by Wild.

The latter on the face of it purports to include in its total all Wild's borrowings from Mrs. Levinge. If it does, then it includes the amount of the former. Mrs. Levinge says that it does not, and was not intended to do so, and that when it was signed she did not realise that the wording had this effect. Whether it does or not is a matter of fact which could, if necessary, be investigated under Section 50 of the Administration of Estates Act, but in the view I take of the whole matter I think this question falls away.

It seems to me fairly certain, from the papers before me, that Commander/^{Wild}died domiciled in the Transvaal. His Estate, consisting only of movables, is situate here, his executrix was appointed by the Master here, and would have to be ~~sold~~^{Sued} here; so that the Transvaal law of prescription is applicable to claims on the Estate.

Of the two notes in favour of Mrs. Levinge, the former is not promissory in its terms, but it is a mere acknowledgment of debt, and as such prescribed under Transvaal Act 26 of 1908 in six years.

The latter, dated 18th June, 1928, contains an acknowledgment of indebtedness, and then is followed by words which I do not think are sufficient to make a promissory note of the document. If it were a promissory note, and unnegotiated, it would be prescribed only after 30 years. But the words "I agree to repay this sum (viz. £1,000) in the future whenever I can, at intervals or in instalments, until the said debt be paid off" do not, in my view, amount to a promissory note because -

- (a) they are not reasonably to be construed as promissory;
- (b) even if there is an engagement to pay, it is not to pay on demand, or at a fixed or determinable future time, but is vague both as to the time of payment and as to what the instalments are to be and what the intervals between them are to be.

This document is thus in the same position as the other, and has been long since prescribed in the Transvaal.

If the law of Natal be applicable, the result is the same, for there, by Law 14 of 1861, all actions on promissory notes and other liquid documents (except mortgages) are prescribed in six years.

It seems to me therefore that Mrs. Levinge has no enforceable claim against the Estate.

The question, raised in the correspondence submitted to me, whether the widow may claim, in

competition with the Estate creditors, for the £1,000 under her antenuptial contract, does not arise, although this gift was uncompleted by the deceased, for there are no other creditors.

The widow has no claim under Act 13 of 1934 (the Succession Act), which has reference only to the spouse of a person who dies either wholly or partly intestate. But she is the only creditor with a valid claim, and I think that the account submitted to me, which awards her the balance of the Estate by virtue of her claim under the antenuptial contract, is in order.

Dear Sir,

I am writing a biography of Commander Frank Wild, C.B.E., the Antarctic explorer, who lived his last years in South Africa and died in 1939. For this purpose I require certain documents which, I understand, are obtainable from your office on payment of the prescribed fees; but I do not know the amount of the fees that would be payable. I write now, therefore, to ask you whether you will kindly inform me of the fees that would be due for each of the following documents; and I enclose a postal order for two shillings to cover the cost of your reply by air mail. On receipt of the information, I will send you postal orders for the sum required, plus postage.

1. Wild's full name was John Robert Francis Wild, and he was a native of Yorkshire. His first marriage was dissolved in DURBAN in 1927. I do not know, but would wish to know, the date of the decree of divorce. I do not know whether the procedure in the divorce courts of Natal is similar to that in England, viz., a decree nisi, which is made absolute three months later. If any copy of any such final decree is issued to anyone other than one of the parties, I should be glad to know its cost. If not, I should be glad to know the exact date on which the divorce decree became effective.

2. Wild married, as his second wife, Miss Beatrice L.R. Rowbotham, of Port Elizabeth, at JOHANNESBURG, on March 18, 1931. I should like to know the cost of a copy of the marriage certificate.

3. Wild died at KLERKSDORP, Transvaal, on August 20, 1939. I should like to know the cost of a copy of the death certificate.

4. I understand that Wild made a will. I should like to know the cost of a copy of it.

If you will kindly supply the information specified in these four numbered paragraphs by air mail, I shall be most grateful. The documents would be of material assistance to me in my project. I hope that the information desired is available, and that I am applying to the right address to ask for it - I was so assured at Somerset House, London.



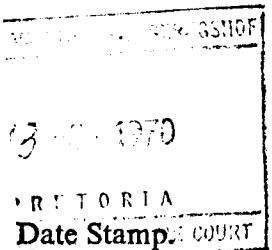
